We made a huge pivot in our programming schedule and moved our winter retreat a little earlier in the year. We wanted to capitalize a little bit on some warmer weather, as well as build solid relationships moving forward through the year. This retreat helps our volunteers forge strong relationships with our students, but also, helps our older students build into the lives of the younger students. Pivoting this retreat to an earlier time, allows those bonds to begin earlier, giving them something to build off of, rather than ending the year on a positive note. We've already seen this paying off, we're just hoping it continues to build.

This retreat is about feeding them well, letting them have fun and keeping them safe; things they miss out on compared to other students. The amount of food they eat is unbelievable. For one weekend, they get healthy meals they can eat to their hearts content and they take advantage of it fully. Essentially, this weekend is a hockey tournament or a weekend getaway all about having fun. Most affluent kids have this experience through dance, sports or even art. This is our opportunity to give them that same kind of experience. A weekend full of fun where they can just be kids. Their home lives can be drastically different from this weekend away, so it's a great opportunity to see these hardened kids come out of their shell when safe. It's trust given that we don't take likely.

In total, we had 55 students trust us and come out for the weekend and out of that number, 25 had never attended. We just hope we can build on that trust, earning the opportunity to speak life into them when the time comes. Also, notice the orange shirts. They appreciated the opportunity to honour their elders by having an orange shirt.

My People

Look at all of our fantastic students we get to see every week! These are the faces that we see every Wednesday at YFCHL!

Consistently we are bringing out around 60 students to our program. These people could be anywhere and everywhere all over Saskatoon, but every Wednesday they come and hang out with us where we bring hope, have fun and offer belonging in a safe community (YFCHL mission statement).

We've had quite a bit of fun getting to know some of these new personalities that have been added to our community. There is still a large percentage of indigenous youth as well as a few more group home kids than we have had in the past. Although this creates new challenges for us, it gives us a lot of hope as we become the safe space they look forward to every Wednesday! Because a significant number of them are young, it gives us hope for life change.

When they come into our program under 12 we can show them a different way. It's not about indoctrinating them with something as much as just loving them. When it comes to the various trauma issues that we are working with consistently, there is a lot of damage control that needs to be done. Dealing with intergenerational trauma is a long game. We believe that the beginning of that is trust and love, once they feel

those two things we can move to guidance. When you've grown up with authority figures that manipulate, abuse or use you, things like respect and trust do not come easy. We earn every little ounce of those things. Whether through good behaviour or bad, it's as though our students are constantly testing us. "Are you here for me? Or for you?" This new group is reminding us about this constantly.

Late September, we were making teams and we had no clue what we're doing. We just didn't know any of these new students or their skill levels. There was a moment where I prayed, thanking God for the many personalities that we didn't yet know, but would soon. That in a few months we'd joke about when we didn't know these kids. Now after Boot Camp, we've made it a little ways down that road with more to come. They're becoming our people and it's a beautiful thing.
